John Bradley Christie, 71 of Fayetteville, Arkansas died Tuesday, February 15, 2005 at his home. He was born December 3, 1933 in Atchison, Kansas to Bradley R. and Stella M. Schlinger Christie. He received his Electrical Engineering degree from University of Kansas and a Masters degree from Georgetown University. He served in the United States Army, and was a member of Central United Methodist Church. He was a retired engineer for NCR. His volunteer work included, Senior Net instructor at Mt. Sequoyah, treasurer of Artists of Northwest Arkansas, and helping at Central United Methodist Church.

He is survived by his wife, Elizabeth Stirling Christie of the home, two sons, Bradley Christie of Richmond, California, and Don Christie of Buffalo, NY, a daughter, Mary Jane Hetzlein of Ithaca, NY, two step-sons, John E.
