Precious memories of the many late night trips Bob and I took to the transmitter on the mountain will always linger!!!Following is the transcript of a tribute that will be made to Bob during KBVA's inspirational music this next Sunday morning, April 25, 2004 (exactly 8 months before Christmas):It was back in 1991. KBVA - Variety 106.5 had just commenced broadcasting across these beautiful Ozarks.One evening during those early days we received a telephone call from a listener. "Do you know that your music is not being broadcast in stereo?" was the question.And so, KBVA radio had its first contact with a transplanted engineer from Milwaukee, Wisconsin, who insisted on good broadcast quality. On that night in the first days of this broadcasting station, Bob and Marilynn phillips became an integral part of the Variety 106.5 broadcasting family.For more than two decades, Bob Phillips served as one of the engineers who was always ready, 24 hours and day - 7 days a week to keep the equipment working so that we could keep the music coming.Robert Arntzen Phillips died April 16, 2004, and is survived by his wife, Marilynn.Bob made a difference with his time and talent - and KBVA Radio is part of that difference he made!So, from Gayla and all of us here at the station, we say, "Thanks, Bob and Marilynn" and we pledge to continue your work with KBVA Variety 106.5.
