She passed away in the arms of her Savior on February 18, 2022, at the age of 74. She grew up on a farm near Holdrege, Nebraska. Evy graduated from Holdrege High School and furthered her education at Hastings College, in Hastings, Nebraska. She received her master's degree in Music at Scarritt College in Nashville, Tennessee. She stated that "Music is my life." Evy was a music director at a church in Stuttgart, Arkansas. After she moved to Fayetteville, Arkansas and started the Shepherd Music School in Rogers, Arkansas, where she taught voice, piano, and guitar. She was also the Chair of the Area 6 Arkansas Handbell Music of America.
